

# WINED UP THE GORGE 2005

The annual season closing event for VCKC brings together all the enthusiasts for racing small boats, from Surf Skis and K1s to OC2s. This year the Club's Marathon Program Manager, Ron Williams, had a little more difficulty than usual in finding eager race participants because so many were "burnt out" by strenuous training for and participation in other national and international events such as The World Games held in Edmonton in late July.

However, Ron found 31 participants from as far away as Bellingham and Vernon for the traditional Gorge Waterway and Portage Inlet Fall challenge of 2005.

He combined tricky buoy placements, brief portages in the creeks that feed into Portage Inlet, and tidal variations to produce a medley of races that would give every category of racer an interesting task.

The C2 Men's Marathon race drew 6 teams for the grueling grind of about 10 km into Portage Inlet Colquitz portage, back to a yellow buoy near the starting line and then return up the Inlet to the Craigflower portage before racing back against the tide to the finish line. The winner of this race was the team of Jonas Hudson and Jean-Francois Gagné with a time of 1:36:34. Second place was taken by Ron Williams (Sr) and Harry James, while 3rd was captured by Gord Wallace and Ron Williams (Jr) in just 1:41:22. A close race.

The C2 Mixed Marathon drew 5 teams for a somewhat shortened course. That was won by the team of Ron Williams (Sr) and Cindy Wright in a time of 1:13:12 closely followed by Jason Hudson and Lauren Telford with a time of 1:14:51 and the team of Alex Mann and Lynn Sanderson with a time of 1:16:08. Also a close race.

#### **CLUB NEWS**

Greeting paddlers.

The arrival of fall and back to school signals that courses are up and running. All those interested in paddling programs should contact the respective coordinator, and while some programs are gearing up, others are winding down. The dragonboat is on land getting some much needed repairs, and the amas have some cracks from hulis that have been required by paddlers at practice.

We are still negotiating the basement renovations with Saanich Parks, but it looks favourable. We had hoped to have talks further along, but all good things come to those who wait. Our recent executive meeting saw another change. Kate Clark was a Director at Large who stepped into the Secretary's position when Alan Thomson regretfully resigned, but Kate has unfortunately resigned as well with family and work commitments. We were pleased to have Jean Chandler (alternate for Linda Thomson who had taken over from Brandy McBeath) volunteer to take minutes.

Your board is flexible, to say the least. With rising costs, insurance, supplies, etc., the board was forced to review fees that had not been raised for many years. Our current fees do not cover our current costs, so as a fiscally responsible board, the 2006 membership fees will be \$45 for singles, and \$60 for families. The outdoor canoe storage fees will also be increased from \$20 to \$30 and the indoor storage will be increased from \$40 to \$60. Even with these increased rates, VCKC maintains the lowest rates in town as storage is usually paid per month, and we charge for a whole year. Our one membership fee covers all paddling, whereas the large businesses charge per activity.

Our mission is still to promote fun safe paddling, and our volunteers have done an excellent job of providing you with these activities. If you have any questions or concerns, please feel free to contact any member of the executive.

**IN SEARCH OF WILD PLACES**: - Exploring the BC Coast. Presented by Chris Cooper at the **General Meeting**, 7:30 p.m. on November 1st.

Chris Cooper has run an adventure tripping company with a fleet of large canoes - voyageur size and larger. In 2004 he had a 42' Montreal-style canoe built by Western Canoeing so that he could undertake longer coastal paddling trips more safely. This large canoe has a spray deck and uses double kayaks as outrigger-style amas, with 4" cross-section aluminum iakos. With this boat, Chris has paddled the west coast of BC from Prince Rupert to Port Hardy, as well as north along the southern part of the Alaska Panhandle. Chris will present pictures of his trips in the summers of 2004 and 2005. Come out and see this presentation of a unique way of seeing the wild coastal places of BC.

## WINED UP RACES from page 1.

Those two races were completed by 4:30 pm on Saturday, 27 August, and all participants had a relaxing BBQ evening at the Club House celebrating the successes of the day AND the 65th birthday of Race Master extraordinaire, Ron Williams (now "very" Sr).

On Sunday, 28 August, additional participants joined for the small craft races comprising of K1s, Surf Skis, OC1s and OC2s for the morning event and C1s for the afternoon race.



The first race on Sunday was assembled at the Tillicum ferry dock in quiet water as the tide was "flat" at 10 am. Ron supervised the maneuvering of fourteen craft in this relatively confined space for a clean start down the Gorge Waterway through the Inner Harbour to the west side of the entrance to Victoria, a course of about 8 km with the return to the VCKC finish line on a gentle flood tide.



With all craft started at the same time, it was expected that the K1s and Surf Skis would be the first to return; indeed it was Jonas Hudson who stormed through the finish in his K1 with a time of 1:04:46 closely followed by Jerome Truran with 1:08:07 and Don Craig with a time of 1:08:22.

The first OC2 returned was crewed by Kevin Hayward and Helen Currey in a time of 1:09:20 closely followed by the first OC1 paddled by J-F Gagné in a time of 1:09:23. The next two OC1s were in the hands of Roman Matieschyn and Pete Hartman with times of 1:14:25 and 1:15:28.

The first OC2 crewed by women, Lauren Telford and Karolyn Jones, returned with a time of 1:18:19, and Sheila O'Shea returned in her K1 at 1:18:42.

After presentation of awards during the lunch hour, the final race of the day and the event was restricted to solo marathon canoes. Here there were 6 men and 2 women competing on a course into Portage Inlet that was very similar to that followed for the C2 mixed race on Saturday afternoon.

The C1 men's competition produced an exciting finish between Ron Williams (Sr) and Gord Wallace. At times each held the lead but it was Ron who crossed the finish line first with a time of 1:11:27 and Gord had to settle for the 2nd place finish 4 seconds later. Third place went to Edoh Amiran of Shuksan with a time of 1:16:25.

The ladies C1 competition consisted of just two entrants, Rosemary Henry and Veronica Wisniewski. Rosemary came in with a time of 1:24:56 and Veronica recorded 1:29:10.

All in all it was a great program executed in the finest of weather conditions. The tides were less favourable than one would wish but added to the challenges that make such events interesting. The spirit of participants and volunteers was outstanding. Of course, without the support of sponsors like Ocean River Sports and Western Canoe & Kayak it would not be possible to continue to bring such enthusiasts together to test their skills.

## **GORGE WATERWAY INITIATIVE**

## **Background**

In January 2005, organizations with an interest in the Gorge Waterway and adjacent watersheds began to meet to discuss their mutual interests.

Over the first nine months of monthly meetings, representatives of groups on what became known as the Gorge Waterway Initiative (GWI) have developed the following understandings:

**What**: A community driven, collaborative group of organizations dedicated to the protection and enhancement of the Gorge Waterway, Portage Inlet and surrounding watersheds in a way that respects the local cultural heritage

**Mission**: To maintain, protect and enhance the health of the Gorge Waterway, Portage Inlet, their watersheds and communities, for the enjoyment and well being of present and future generations

**Vision**: A healthy environment in perpetuity for all life in the Gorge Waterway, Portage Inlet and surrounding watersheds

#### Goals:

- To encourage and promote education, stewardship, and awareness programs and appropriate land and water uses
- To serve as a hub for information sharing and act as a point of contact for waterway issues
- To encourage and advocate for the protection, restoration and enhancement of the waterway and its watersheds
