Canoe Program Report

Canoe Program Meeting

The next Canoe Program meeting will be held at the Clubhouse on Monday, January 18 at 7:30pm. The main presentation will be on a paddling trip to Haida Gwaii (Queen Charlotte Islands) by Jean Chandler. All Club members are welcome to attend.

The meeting will be preceded by a meeting of canoeing instructors to schedule the season's courses. The Program has a 'new to the Club' canoe, a Yukon by Clipper Canoes. This boat replaces one of the old Club canoes that had not been used for years. The new canoe will be available for courses and, if needed, for Club canoe trips. As far as is known, this is the first flatwater canoe purchase the Club has ever made — to date we have relied on boats made at schools or donated to the Club.

All paddles start by getting together at the Clubhouse at 9:00am. The usual trip involves 3-4 hours of paddling and we aim to be back at the Clubhouse by around 4:00pm.

If you are no longer interested in participating drop me a reply to that effect and the harassment will stop. Otherwise it's "game on". Club boats are available for rental use by moving water course graduates but give me a call to make sure one is available. Sometimes a tandem seat will open up if you need a partner. See you on the river!

Voyageur Program

With the loss of Don Munroe's leadership, (aka Mr. Voyageur) over so many years, the Voyageur Program needs to find some way to continue to use the Club's Big Canoes in a regular way. While the Paddle To Port Angeles will not take place in 2010, the Club's executive committee has decided that we should continue to raise money for Camp Shawnigan and are considering other ways in which this can be done. Whatever is decided, it is likely that the voyageur canoes will continue to play a key role.

An e-mail will be sent to all VCKC members on the Voyageur Program list asking interested members to meet and consider what a new Voyageur Program should look like and how it should operate.

News from the Voyageur Brigade Society

After the epic David Thompson Brigade trip in 2009, the Brigade Society is running a second leg in 2010 from Thunder Bay, Ontario to Montreal, Quebec. The dates are July 8 to August 10, 2010. The event registrar can be contacted at 2010registrar@gmail.com.

In 2011, the Voyageur Brigade Society is organizing a third brigade, this time following the Columbia River. This trip, about 1800 kilometres long, will take place from May 21 to July 15, 2011. As this is a route relatively close to Victoria, there may be some interest in entering a Club team for this event. Details are not finalized but the intent is for this brigade to travel five, not six days per week, so the pace will not be as hard as the 2009 Thompson Brigade. Also, none of the paddling will be upstream, although many stretches will be on the lakes behind dams, so some early starts can be expected to get the distance covered before the winds get up. If anyone is interested in leading or joining a Club team to take part in this proposed Brigade, please let Alan Thomson know.

The Friday Flyers have invited Jean Chandler to show her slides from her her hiking trip along the "Camino de Santiago (Way of St James)".

As club members know, Jean is the type of canoeist that legends are made of. We are all very excited about the prospect of watching her slides. Club members are all invited of course. A little research reveals:

"Today, about 2.5 million people a year visit Santiago de Compostela, mostly by car, bus, plane and train, as well as by more challenging "pilgrimatic" methods.

The camino begins in France, is 900 km long and takes about 30 days of walking. One popular alternative starting point is Gothic cathedral in Léon, Spain. From Léon, it takes four to six hours of walking per day for seven straight days to reach Santiago.

The walking paths are always open, free (humble) accommodation is available along the route, and the way to Santiago passes through spectacular scenery and interesting pilgrimage towns.

To obtain an official certificate of pilgrimage, you must walk at least 100 kilometres or bike at least 200 kilometres of the route. The network of shelters along the way will stamp your passport as evidence"

Free Spray Cover

with openings for bow and stern paddlers. Fits a canoe 16' 8" long with a 3' beam, such as some of the local McCooeys.

Elastic cord all around; you'll need hooks outside the gunwales to take the cord or you could probably do something clever with Velcro.

Because of the attachment method you'd probably use this on open water, not a river. Ideal for paddling in the rain.

Koksilah River Run


