CANOE PROGRAM

Club Flatwater Paddle Sunday 11th January

A new year and a lot of pent-up paddling energy. In spite of the attraction of a parallel river trip, 28 paddlers in 16 boats turned out to explore Somenos Lake, Creek and Richards Creek. The water level was lower than we'd have liked (5.8M on the gauge on the Forestry rail line trestle), but OK for the outing. In spite of vehicle sharing, there were at least 10 cars/trucks at the put-in, which didn't leave much room for any one arriving later. Thanks to people being on time and quick to move equipment, the Victoria contingent were at the ramp by 9.30 and everyone was on the water by 10.05.

The lake had mist across the surface - we couldn't see the far side, but the honks of geese and swans told us there was more water out there. There was also the presence of a seal in the lake, something Tod has seen before, but I've never noticed. Up Richards Creek past Herd Road and on towards Richards Trail. Our presence disturbed some water fowl, but not as much as the duck hunters in a punt on the adjacent (flooded) field. With 28 chatting paddlers, no ducks were sitting for their 'pleasure'.

The creek bed - really a ditch - could be followed quite far, but new fences with taut barbed wire prevented some of the 'over field' excursions we've enjoyed in the past. We managed a couple of side trips onto parallel fields, but there were always shallow grassy patched to pole over. Also, some of the fields appeared to have been left fallow, which made for more grasses. Peter put on a 'how not to exit your kayak' display, and was lucky to have Tod, John and Brenda nearby to help him to shore and safety.

Lunch on the far side of the lake, dry, no wind and the mist vanished, then on down the rapids of Somenos Creek. There are no rapids, but with a falling tide in Cowichan Bay, there was noticeable current. There was quite a lot of freshwater weed that we hadn't noticed on past trips - probably Elodea Canadensis. It is rapidly narrowing the creek below Lakes and Tzouhalem roads, and most people turned back at the latter bridge due to dense weed. It was possible to

proceed further, almost to the Cowichan River, where a log across the stream made further progress impossible without landing and dragging the boats over. As nearly everyone else had turned back at the Tzouhalem Road Bridge, we didn't try this but headed back up stream. The seal made its last appearance just at the log jam: although some say it was a beaver, there was no tail slap, so I am not sure.

In fact, for the first time in a number of years, there was little sign of beaver activity on either Richards or Somenos Creek - no lodges, no freshly cut and peeled twigs of willow. Back on Somenos Lake, there were about 100 swans out in the centre of the lake - lovely to see, and to hear their honking conversation.

All in all, a very good start to the flatwater paddling for 2015. Thanks to all those who turned out, some for the first time - Peter, Ken, Barb, Brian, Wayne, Bon, Susan, John, Brenda, Sandy, Carolyn, Roger, Pat, Tod, Dan, Karen, Mollie, Shawn, Helene, Julie-Ann, Mark, Debbie, Joe, Dina, Jack, Jen and, of course, Linda.dishes and drinks. Thanks to all who took part, especially John and Brenda, absent from this event for a few years, and Don, for whom this was probably his 32nd New Year paddle with the Club.

Happy New Year Everyone! The Canoe Program's 2015 paddle season started with a splash last weekend when over thirty Club canoeists participated in Club lake and river paddles. Special thanks to all organizers and participants. Over the coming year, the Club will be offering fairly regular lake and river paddling opportunities. Keep an eye out for email notice of these Club paddles. In addition to the courses, the annual Frost Free Weekend and Running of the Cows (the one day Cowichan lake to Duncan paddle) are open to qualified paddlers.

Trip - Lower Cowichan run Sunday 11th January Twelve canoeists took to the Lower Cowichan River on Sunday, Jan. 11 for the first Eddy-Hopper of the New Year. With a spontaneity shocking for a VCKC event, the trip was organized in 48 hours. Turnout was great, with 4 OC-1s and 4 OC-2s, although only two paddlers were truly qualified for an Eddy-Hopper! Originally envisioned as easy runs for newer, or less-experienced paddlers, Eddy-Hoppers are also popular with veteran river-bashers looking for a mellow trip with old friends. A wealth of instructors, ex-instructors, experienced. and weathered paddlers turned out for the Stoltz Pool to Vimy section of the lower Cowichan with plenty of time for on-river socializing and playing at the Splits and Vimy hole, with the Cow running in the mid-80s.

With the Duncan Gauge reading 1.35 (84 m³/s), the river was still in the 'high' range, but many playable features, inundated in recent weeks, were beginning to show. And while the Lower run, (Stoltz Pool to Vimy,) might appear featureless to paddlers in small kayaks, there was a good assortment of eddies, wave trains, and surf waves well suited to larger solo or tandem canoes. In particular, the Vimy Wave was prime for tandem boats, and well worth the wait in line for a turn. Doug still misses the turn for the Vimy takeout every time, and Rick provided ample puns. Some things never change. Thanks to Rick, Tim, Bob, Sharon, Craig, Martin, Anita, Jay, Pete, Lorne, and Jack. Our thanks to Doug Magnuson for organizing the event.

VOYAGEUR PROGRAM

34th Annual Voyageur Paddle for the Kids - March 28, 2015

Planning for the 2015 Peninsula Paddle for the Kids is getting under way. This annual fundraising event at VCKC is in support of the Lions Society Easter Seal Camp at Shawnigan Lake. The camp allows children with disabilities to enjoy a summer camp experience in a safe environment. Funds raised by the club help the Lions Society operate the facility for children and families with special needs.

The route follows the shore of the Saanich Peninsula from Brentwood Bay to the Clubhouse. We paddle Voyageur canoes with two teams of 6 or 7 per boat. Each team paddles up to 2 hours and then switches off with another team. The whole trip is about 40 miles and takes 10-12 hours to complete. Bus transportation, great food, and a warm dry rest area are provided by the local Lions Club. It all makes for a great day of paddling for a good cause.

The paddle will take place this year on **Saturday March 28**th. There will be 7 practice paddles leading up to that date. Practice paddles can be the best part of the program. You can expect an adventure on every outing.

All trips but the first two will start by meeting at the Clubhouse at 8:30am where ride shares and boat towing are arranged. Please bring a paddle, PFD, dry bag, dry clothes, weather-appropriate clothing, food, and water.
