Voyageur Director Update

37th Annual Voyageur Paddle for the Kids – March 28, 2018

Planning for the 2018 *Peninsula Paddle for the Kids* is getting under way. This annual fundraising event at VCKC is in support of the Lions Society Children's Charities. While Camp Shawnigan will be closed this year, the Lion's Society continues to provide needed support to families with sick children throughout BC. Funds raised by the club help the Lions Society operate the facility for children and families with special needs.

The route follows the shore of the Saanich Peninsula from Brentwood Bay to the Clubhouse. We paddle Voyageur canoes with two teams of 6 or 7 per boat. Each team paddles up to 2 hours and then switches off with another team. The whole trip is about 40 miles and takes 10-12 hours to complete. Bus transportation, great food, and a warm dry rest area are provided by the local Lions Club. It all makes for a great day of paddling for a good cause.

The paddle will take place this year on **Saturday March 24**th. There will be 7 practice paddles leading up to that date. Practice paddles can be the best part of the program. You can expect an adventure on every outing.

Practice Trips and Dates

Sundays February 4th, 11th, 18th, and 25th Sundays March 4th, 11th and 18th

All trips but the first two will start by meeting at the Clubhouse at 8:30am where ride shares and boat towing are arranged. Please bring a paddle, PFD, dry bag, dry clothes, weatherappropriate clothing, food, and water. This program is open to all VCKC members. If you can't paddle with us, please remember to help support Lions Society Charities.

Speaking of new things, we have also purchases ten more long metal paddles for classes and club trips. Our previous selection was short on the longer paddles. Over the Christmas break we should have them painted with VCKC so they can join the selection at the clubhouse. Sometimes new things become older looking... the newest club Clipper Prospector had a violent meeting with a tree on the Sooke River during an Eddie Hopper. I guess its good to know that you can wrap a Clipper Duraflex canoe around a tree and still paddle it off the river, or at least across. Dan, Alan and Ken have been working on restoring the canoe. It should be good as new, but just not look as pretty it used to be. We should be able to let you know by the next newsletter.

The BC Marine Trails Network (BCMTN) was incorporated in 2009 with the support of nine paddling clubs and a core group of directors. They began the massive task of inventorying potential sites along the entire BC coastline now estimated at 3100 sites. In 2011 two new trails—Gulf Islands and the West Coast North Trail—opened with a celebration coordinated by Stephanie Meinke and Paul Grey at Ladysmith's Transfer Beach.

In 2015 the BCMTNA announced the opening of the Sea to Sky Marine Trail with financing help from the Trans Canada Trail and support from Recreation Sites and Trails BC. Today, bear boxes and signage have been installed. The sites are now maintained by the Sea Kayak Association of BC. Later in 2015, the BCMTNA started a membership program which has grown to over 500 members at the end of 2017. Members are provided amazing tools and benefits to help plan their trips.

The stewardship committee has conducted some important clean ups from 2014 – 2017 including removal of tonnes of debris from the West Coast of Vancouver Island, clean up of Chained and Gerald Islands.

In 2016, the BCMTNA started the Salish Sea Marine Trail (SSMT) project and continued work on the development of several documents including a Master Plan, signage documents, and the BC Ferries Walk On/Paddle Away paper. In the same year, the BCMTNA received charitable status.

2017 marked several successes including the completion of the SSMT (some work still to be done) and a great celebration on Newcastle Island with the Snuneymuxw. As well several new recreation sites have been established in the Discovery Islands. This took a number of years and persistent follow-up to establish new rec and new reserve campsites. The BCMTNA is currently working with BC Parks on a new provincial marine (trails) strategy. We are marching ahead with new and innovative ideas on creating trails, directed by a strong board of directors and committee members!

VCKC continues to support VCKC as a member and with a club representative to BCMTN. Alan Thomson, Roy Scully and now Jean Chandler have represented VCKC and supported the BCMTN. A number of VCKC members are also members of BCMTN. Benefits of membership include extensive information useful when planning a trip on the BC coastline and opportunities to participate in stewardship of campsites in the network.
