Before the executives decide to proceed with this suggestion, we decided to ask the membership about their interest.


If there is sufficient interest, the executive will commit the funds to order some and advise those interested that the mug order will proceed.

## **Big Canoe Program Update** (previously called Voyageur Program)



### **Canoe Program Update**



The large number of paddlers was greatly increased by the crews from Monroe and Canada that could be used due to the good water level on the river. The level was about 55cmps at the Duncan gauge and the river was a beautiful and easy paddle. Most rocks were well covered, yet the river was not high enough to be pushy. Vimy wave was in its wavy glory, but a little hard for solo canoes to get onto. The sunny and warm run down the river was accompanied by the fisherman lining the banks, and the salmon in the shallows. The run was over far too soon.

The Remembrance Day ceremony at Stolz Pool is getting bigger. This year featured veterans leading a short ceremony and mentioned that next year they are looking for a piper. The paddle also had a good turnout, with close to 30 paddlers (including 2 stand up paddle boarders!). The UVIC Kayak club also had a strong presence in the paddle with some members also paddling canoe.



The canoe program will need a new director for the new year. We have a new trailer and I plan to camp as much as possible and find new lakes to fish. You will need to attend two evening meetings a month, answer canoe email, co-ordinate courses and club paddles. If you love canoeing this is a great way to volunteer.

### **Kayak Program Update**

Our 2<sup>nd</sup> Kayak Program meeting took place Wednesday, November 14<sup>th</sup> at 7:30pm at the clubhouse. Of the 11 initiatives that have been identified for the Kayak Program there are 4 immediate upcoming clinics to watch for over the next month or two:

- Use of a pool to practice kayak skills We have a new VCKC member Pearson College!! Pearson College has a kayak program and their kayak instructor is Garth Irwin. Garth was a member of VCKC 18 years ago and has come back to the fold. The college has a pool that Garth has suggested we will be able to use for clinics over the winter months. This is so exciting! I will be meeting with Garth at the college over the next week or two to discuss the possibilities. We are looking at clinics to practice rescues, paddle strokes, braces and rolls. Keep your eye on the calendar for clinic dates.
- How to choose a kayak Are you new to kayaking and confused about how to choose the right kayak for yourself? Skeg or rudder or neither, rotomolded, thermoformed, fiberglass, Kevlar the list goes on it's so confusing!! Come out and talk to the expert. Roy Scully will be offering a clinic in January to help you sort through all the confusion. If time permits he will also cover how to choose a paddle.
- Practice wet exits and re-entry in cold water brrr© This is really hard to make yourself do, but
  actually a very valuable skill to practice. Getting dumped on a sunny, warm day in calm water is one
  thing. Getting dumped in cold, choppy water is quite another and the more likely scenario. We will
  be putting together a clinic during these cold winter months so that members can experience the
  cold-water wet exit in a safe controlled environment.
- How to make a Greenland Paddle popularity of the Greenland paddle is growing exponentially.
  The Greenland Paddle has advantages where fatigue and wind resistance over longer distances
  are an issue. If you would like to learn how to make your own Greenland Paddle watch the calendar
  for the clinic date.

Two more initiatives are being actively worked on at the moment: VHF licensing and use, and an equipment "swap and shop" at VCKC - more on those events soon. I will send emails to members who have identified "kayak" as an interest when dates are set for each of the clinics.

The next Kayak Program meeting is scheduled for January 9<sup>th</sup>, 2019.

Come out and join the Christmas Boat parade. We had lots of fun and laughs last year as we decorated our boats and embarked on a leisurely paddle up and down the Gorge in the dark with our boats all lit up. Then back to the club for a pot-luck meal and more socializing. This year I know that there will be at least one Stand Up Paddle Boarder among us and I, for one, am interested to see how he will decorate himself and/or his board<sup>©</sup> If you would like to use a club kayak there are still kayaks available. Come out and join the fun December 8<sup>th</sup>. I'm sure details of time and place, etc. are posted in this newsletter.

**Announcement:** The Kayak Directors (myself and Roy Scully) are stepping down from the executive for our individual personal reasons. We are actively seeking a director. If you are a keen to see the kayak program grow and would like to provide opportunities for VCKC members to become proficient sea

Members must have successfully completed the Paddle Canada Kayak Basic Skills course or have equivalent skills. Members using club kayaks must always paddle with one or more "buddles".
