Safety at VCKC

Those few of you who, like me, are constantly frustrated by computers will appreciate my frustration in November. I thought that I had emailed to our newsletter editor, Susan, a note much like the following for in the December newsletter. When it did not appear, I checked to see if I had just not pushed the send button. To my surprise there was no sign of the note anywhere in my computer! So here it is, a month late, but still relevant!

We are now into the time of seasonal change. Colder weather and colder water are upon us, we saw ice on the Gorge a couple of weeks ago. Most flat water paddlers do not wear wet or dry suits. This fall we had a couple of flat water paddlers dump on an ocean beach. Both were wearing wet or dry suits resulting in a mild inconvenience compared with a miserable time, especially if they did not have a dry change. Prepare for the worst, leave those blue jeans and cotton T-shirts behind, and fully enjoy the best of our paddling world, even on a bad day.

OC6 paddlers

All regular OC6 paddlers know their job should be huli happen. However, some teams regularly have subs. Sometimes several paddlers will shift from their normal positions, e.g. when a caller is replaced. When a sub is paddling it is a good idea for the stern to run through all six duty positions. If this is done regularly every paddler should know the duty of each seat position and so be ready wherever they are assigned. It is two years since we had an accidental huli but, we all need to be prepared!

Kayak Program Update

2019 will bring lots of changes to the VCKC Kayak Program. Roy Scully and myself are stepping down as Program Directors and the January elections will bring in a new Program Director. This individual will continue work on the many initiatives begun in 2018 but will also bring new ideas and perspective to the program.

As noted in last month's newsletter some things to watch for over the winter months:

- Use of a pool to practice kayak skills
- How to choose a kayak

- Practice wet exits and re-entry in cold water
- How to make a Greenland Paddle

Two more initiatives are being actively worked on at the moment: VHF licensing and use, and an equipment “swap and shop” at VCKC - more on those events soon.

The next Kayak Program meeting is tentatively scheduled for January 9th, 2019. The new Program Director will send a confirmation email to VCKC members about the date of this meeting and any upcoming clinics. While Roy and I are stepping down from the role of director we both plan to continue to offer Kayak Basic Skills and Level 1 courses at VCKC in 2019.

I have enjoyed this past year as Kayak Program Director and I’d like to thank the membership for giving me the opportunity to represent them on the VCKC Executive board. The Executive Team has been a fun, dedicated group of people to work with. Over the past couple of years we have purchased two new and one used kayak and some much needed kayak equipment, so that we can better offer kayak courses and clinics. We now have a fleet of 6 kayaks, all in good working order.

Finally, once again a reminder: The club kayaks are for VCKC members use when taking courses or clinics, or when participating in club sanctioned paddles (Tuesday Night Paddles, day trips and camping). These kayaks are also available to VCKC members for personal use on the Gorge Waterway - on the club side of the Tillicum Bridge only. Members must have successfully completed the Paddle Canada Kayak Basic Skills course or have equivalent skills. Members using club kayaks must always paddle with one or more “buddies”. Tim Trip 2019 (The Big Canoe Summer Adventure)

Well here is what you all were waiting for, Tim Trip 2019, **Kyuquot Sound and North to Brooks Peninsula.**

We will be paddling two Big Canoes; the **35’ Salish Style STA’QEYA** and the **29’ Tillicum**, both are terrific canoes with great load carrying abilities, speed, and stability, just terrific seaworthy canoes. The down side: as great as they are on the water, they are a little on the heavy side especially lugging them up and down the beach between low and high tide.

We will **leave responsibly early (not insanely early) July 2** and drive to Artlish River put in and have a short paddle up stream to camp on the river bars. For the next week and a half we will explore Kyuquot Sound, the Mission Group, the Bunsby Islands, and up to the South Shores of Brooks Peninsula. If time and weather permits, our return may include Rugged Point Provincial Park. We will be passing the village of Kyuquot, so a mid-





whales. If you are poor in Math, there are **countless sandy beaches.** Sadly there are no hot springs, but on my last trip here, people did enjoy many swims in the ocean or freshwater streams close to the campsites.

Many spots have limited tenting sights so I am limiting our group size to **maximum of 16 paddlers.** Because the canoes are large and require a certain amount of muscle power on the water and on the land I am looking for **minimum of 14 paddlers.** It might be worthwhile sharing a tent if you can find someone who doesn't mind your snoring. Then instead of sleeping on the 16th best site, you might be able to enjoy the 1st best site.

Participants need to be fit and have experience with extended, unsupported camping. Weather should be pretty good for most of the trip. Much of the worst of WestCoast weather happens at a different time of year. Much of the seasonal bad weather is blocked by Brooks Peninsula to the North. All should be prepared to deal with bad weather if/when it comes. Southerly storms are very possible and could keep us shore bound for a day or two. Fog is possible but more likely later in the month and typical in August and later.

Paddling experience can be gained by participating in the Club's "Paddle For The Kids". In Fact all Tim Trip Paddlers should plan on participating in this fund raiser. Although we are traveling in remote areas of the WestCoast it is not as isolated as might first appear. Two summers ago we encountered a couple of guided kayak groups and some sport fishers. Chartered water taxi service is available most of the time.

Enjoy some photos of the area and then send your **\$100 deposit to Mary** at mmarkscanoe@gmail.com. Total cost for the trip should be very reasonable. (Without putting much thought into this as I write, I can't see why this \$100 is not going to be more than enough.) We have the trip about half prescribed before this newsletter goes out, so don't wait too long.
