Hello All,

Wow, it is no longer Summer! I hope you can find some paddling opportunities between the wind and rain days. No doubt some hardy paddlers were out because of the wind and rain. Play safe! The whitewater paddlers have some pumping rivers and are all smiles at the start of their season.

The executive is still plugging away doing who knows what, but it seems very important at the time and takes twice as long as one might expect. With the change of season, the club house basement was getting very damp. We have adjusted the furnace for more heat in the basement, added a dehumidifier and a general fan. Thanks Mike Wheatley for sorting this out. Please leave things running as you find them. Mike will monitor how things work out.

We have slightly altered how we clean club PFDs. Instead of using so much water washing with soap, please spray the PFDs with the

alcohol spray provided before you clean your paddle craft and leave outside until after other gear is cleaned and put away. Allowing them to air outside awhile will reduce undesirable odours and moisture inside.

I would like to thank our membership for the generally consistent following of our COVID-19 mitigation plan. On occasion the compound has been left unlocked or login sheets have been left in the rain. We do not have a designated cleaner in the clubhouse anymore, so that brings a little extra responsibility to each of us to check what we are doing and do a little extra if we see something needs attention. I know some of you have done much extra to help things stay clean and safe. Thank you.

Dan has assembled materials for the final stage of our compound renewal but one of his key helpers had an altercation with a deer recently, so construction has been delayed. A little extra patience is required moving around in the compound. Rest assured this is temporary. (The deer is dead, the motorcycle on life support, the President will recover.)

The executive is putting together a process to have a virtual AGM. It could be a multi part process, so watch this space and possibly a couple of mass emails for instructions on how that will unfold. COVID - 19 Protocol Update

There has been a few changes to the cleaning protocol:

- PFDS will now be sprayed with a 70% alcohol solution outside (a light spray to the front of the PFD) prior to cleaning other club equipment used. They are to remain outside while you clean the other equipment to allow airdry time. They can then be placed back on the appropriate size peg for the next person.
- Locks and the keypad will be wiped down with an alcohol wipe daily.

As part of our reopening agreement with Saanich all members must attend an orientation session and sign the new waiver prior to participating in any club event or course. If you have not been able to comply with this requirement and plan to be active this fall please contact secretary@vckc.ca to be added to a list. When there are a minimum of five members requesting the orientation session one will be scheduled. To date only 218 of our 480 active members have completed the process. If you bring a guest to paddle even if they bring their own equipment they need to sign the log (contact tracing sheet).

A fan has been placed in the basement to assist with air circulation. Please do not turn the fan off!!

Since the washroom in the basement is the only one available to members we ask that everyone take care to ensure that it is kept clean and that paper towels are not littering the floor.

We have been experiencing some difficulties with the basement door so please confirm that it is closed and locked before you leave. There have also been a few times when the compound has also been left unlocked. This puts our equipment at risk. After you lock the compound, dock or storage under the deck please make sure you spin more than one number.

Remembrance Day Paddle on the Cowichan



The VCKC Canoe program will be holding its Annual Remembrance Day Cowichan River Paddle on Wednesday November 11. This event is open to all VCKC members who have completed the Basic Moving Water course at a minimum.

This is a great river event for both novice and experienced river paddlers alike. If you completed one of our Moving Water courses this past year, this is a great opportunity to hone your skills while having lots of fun on the river during salmon run.

The schedule is as follows:

- 8 am meet at VCKC clubhouse to gather equipment and arrange ride shares (if possible)
- 9 am meet at Serious Coffee, Boys Road, Duncan
- 10 am Arrive at Stoltz Pool boat ramp to gear up, dress up, and run shuttle vehicles
- 11 am Observe Remembrance at the Burma Star Memorial (Stoltz Pool Boat Ramp)
- 11:30 onward Paddle the Cowichan River (class 1&2) down to Vimy Road takeout

If you have you require a club canoe, please contact Louise at canoebooking@vckc.ca. We will get those loaded onto the VCKC trailer on the evening of Tuesday November 10th.

This will need to be a safe socially-distanced event:

- Masks are required during any vehicle shuttles
- We will split into smaller groups (up to 8) and run the river in stages
- Big Canoes are not available this year due to COVID small solo and tandem canoes and kayaks only
- All club equipment will need to be cleaned well before being put away at the end of the day.

If you are interested in this event, you can register <u>Here</u>. Joe will receive an email when you have registered. This will help him get an idea of numbers and ensure no one gets left behind. Of course, the river is free to all. If you are organized to paddle the river, see you in Duncan at 9 am or at Stoltz

Kayak Update

Wow the response to the Paddle Stroke Clinic this fall has been amazing. They are fully subscribed within a few hours of sending out the notice. We will try to schedule more. We are planning to offer clinics on rescue techniques as well as rolling starting in the spring when the water gets warmer. If you have ideas for other clinic topics send an email to kayak@vckc.ca.

A reminder to everyone that you need to connect with the kayak booking volunteer (kayakbookings@vckc.ca) if you want to use a club kayak for courses, clinics or paddles. The addition of regularly scheduled paddles on the Gorge has increased usage so book early. After your paddle be sure to remove any free standing water from the cockpit and all hatches using the sponge provided. This will assist with the humidity issue in the basement. You also need to ensure that all safety accessories are left with the kayak. If you find something missing send a



note to kayak@vckc.ca. Also please ensure that they are stored bow first to help protect the rudders and skegs.

I received this comment from a member about an incident that they witness-

"the gentleman was borrowing a kayak standing in it on the gravel. We had just set our canoe down in the muddy section with no rocks, where he should have been if he wanted to stand In the kayak! He was having problems trying to put his skirt on, so he was trampling in this poor boat for over 20 minutes on sharp rocks."

Please treat club equipment with the same care and respect that you would your own. The kayaks are durable, but mistreatment can cause serious damage.

Last month I introduced the prospective new course instructors. This month I want to introduce the volunteers who will be providing additional paddles/trips for members. Please join me in welcoming Jason Doucet, Craig Thomson, Ryan Ovens and Richard Weir to the team. With these additional volunteers we are hoping to offer many more paddle trips. Since Jason lives in the Chemainus area he is hoping to offer some day trips that will feature waterways in his area. Plans are also being considered for a multi-day trip this summer for the experienced paddlers (Level 2).

We have seen a flurry of activity since reopening aimed at getting members on the water, things will start to slow down a bite. Since we are not able to use the clubhouse for the theory section during the colder months we are experimenting with Zoom as an alternative. If this works we will offer a few more Basic and level 1 courses before spring.

Marathoners have been enjoying the great Fall weather and while there was a brief time-out due to smoke avoidance measures, participation has been steady and enthusiastic. While the annual Fall clubhouse clean-up is on hold, some of the marathon boats need a tune-up before the weather turns cold. We plan to inspect the boats for scrapes and gouges, rusted hardware, mis-aligned seat sliders and the like; and paddles for wear-and-tear from hitting rocks.

Saturday regulars and it's been great to introduce them to both the program and the Gorge Waterway. At the same time, plans are underway to purchase three used paddles for the club so new members can get started right away. The marathon paddling is an early-morning, year-round program and while several layers of clothing will soon become the order of the day, it's never long before you have to shed a layer or two and reach for your water bottle. Early morning outings are a great time to see fish jumping, seals and otters, and the geese and ducks busy filling themselves with eelgrass.

The two OC1 boats continue to see enthusiastic use. I can confirm they are very difficult to flip and not too difficult to right, leaving only a bit of water in the footwells. Anyone who wants to take them out only needs to send a request to outrigger@vckc.ca

We are one step closer to getting the OC6 back on the water. CORA, following direction from the BC viaSport Return-to-Sport Guidelines at https://www.viasport.ca/return-sport, is now endorsing OC6 paddling as a "field of play" activity. Given the current rise in numbers of cases increasing the number of activities is not a recommendation supported by our various health authorities. In preparation, for when the time is right, the executive will be discussing what size of cohort to recommend to the members and any other required guidelines. These amendments would become part of our mitigation plan. If you have any ideas you would like to share send me an email.
