

The following roles are still vacant and available, and welcoming nominations! If you have the availability and inclination to help out with our club please be in touch for more information.

<u>Vice-President</u> shall assist the President in the performance of their duties, and in the absence of the President, carry out the duties of that position; ideally this person is currently active as an Executive Member, so as to be familiar with the current Executive group activities.

<u>Education</u>, <u>Standards</u>, <u>and Safety Director</u> shall promote safe paddling, recommend safety standards, represent the instructors, and advise the Directors on risk management. Previous activities have included organizing huli practices, reviewing club equipment with program directors for any safety concerns, reviewing any reported safety incidents for learning opportunities and best practice moving forward etc.


<u>House and Grounds Director</u> shall advise the Directors on the maintenance of the Clubhouse facilities and coordinate construction and maintenance projects. The Director shall also organize the spring and fall cleanup of the

clubhouse and grounds, during which all regular club activities shall cease. Previous activities have been various - from organizing the build of new storage racks in the yard, to keeping up with lightbulb replacement and contacting service workers for any required repairs etc.

<u>Newsletter Editor</u> (Board Appointed) - is responsible for soliciting materials to be published, determining the features of a publication, setting and enforcing deadlines, making a final determination about what will be published in an issue, coordinating frequency of publication (10 issues/year), and overseeing all operations of a publication. This is a great position for someone with good document formatting skills, as each month they compile the content provided to them for the newsletter that goes out to members.

If you know of anyone who you think would be interested or you would recommend for a position, please let us know. Most Positions can be shared between 2 people; however, the position will still have just one vote. All Executive positions are for one year term.

Big Canoe had a great turn out for the kickoff for the Paddle for the Kids Event with a record attendance of 5 boats in the water and rescue presentation after the lunch. It is great to see the hopeful ending of the Pandemic as we look to have pre covid attendance rates for our training days and the big day of the fundraiser.

Big Canoe is already full speed ahead with the training days every weekend for the Paddle for the Kids (PTFK) Fundraising on April 1st. It is great to see a wonderful turn out for the first training day of the PTFK with 5 boats out in at Sooke Basin and 39 people in the boats. We have a projected attendance of the same number for the Ladysmith Paddle coming up on Sunday.

Marathon and Small Boats

The marathon and small boat program is holding its own over the winter paddling season. We are fortunate that a paddler or two from colder climbs (e.g., Ontario), migrate West for some of the Winter months to paddle. We also have paddlers, as I'm sure other program do, that are experiencing a full Victoria Winter for the first time and are very interested in paddling in the winter. After all, it's not like snow and outdoor

skating are local options! While cold weather itself is not a major deterrent, wind often is, given how lightweight nature of a marathon canoe. Regardless, a core group continue make it out on the water three or four times a week.

The focus at this time of year, for the most part, is to maintain skill and conditioning levels until the weather breaks and more intense training is safer and timely.

WUTG 2023

The Marathon and Small Boats program is also gearing up for Wake up the Gorge 2023 on March 25-26. In addition to likely entering a team or two in the OC6 races on the 25th, small boat races will take place on Sunday March 26th. Unfortunately, the tide is too strong at the Tillicum Narrows to accommodate boats that day. So the small boat race (OC1-2) on Sunday morning will complete two loops of a 10km race course that will start at the club and go to the entrance to Portage Islet and back to the clubhouse (2 - 5km loops). The marathon single (MC1) and other small boats (kayak, surfski, SUP) will complete the same course later the same morning, while the MC2 race will take place in the early afternoon. Details are posted on the WUTG website.

For anyone who is interested in competing in the Sunday am small boat race using one of the three club OC1s, prior screening and an orientation session is required. For more information, email marathon@vckc.ca
