Marathon and Small Boats

It's been my habit (I am a creature of habits) to lead with a marathon update, followed by small boats. This time I'll do the reverse.

Small Boats update



Hurricane OC1

Outrigger canoes have a long and storied history of exploring territories near and far. At VCKC, in addition to the OC6s we have five OC1s and one OC2 that is on the verge of being water ready.

Of the five OC1s, there are two yellow OC1s which are very stable, easy to assemble, and a great transition from other types of paddling. The Hurricane OC1 (white) is the more stable of the three remaining OC1s. The two Scorpius XSs, (black/ gray and green) are less stable, yet they are still accessible with some required training and skill development.

That said, all the OC1s (and OC2) require a pre-use orientation before the on-line booking system can be accessed. This is a great time of year to try out a new form of paddling if you are not familiar with OC1s. For more information and to arrange an orientation session, email marathon@vckc.ca

OC1 Clinic

The upcoming Shuswap River at Enderby get together on June 10 -11 will see several participating.
